SUMMARY: (U) This report contains information obtained from enemy documents and concerns three circulars from the 25th Sector (Kandal Province), Special Region, National United Front of ((Red)) Khmers. Circular 37 pertains to regulations on maintaining good relations with the VC/NVA; Circular 184 pertains to bivouacking and travel regulations for VC/NVA troops in the Khmer Republic; and Circular 10 directs subordinate villages to submit rosters of combatants already equipped with weapons.

(C) CDEC COMMENT: These documents were captured on 24-27 February 1972 in the Khmer Republic (VT972152 - WT082195; Takeo Province) by the 93rd and 42nd Ranger Bns, RVNAF IV Corps. The documents were received at CDEC on 11 April 1972, and were summarized in Bulletin Number 48,601, dated 14 April 1972, under Items 1 - 3 of three items of CDEC Document Log Number 04-1408-72. Translation was requested by JESPAO.

C I R C U L A R

From: Front Committee, 25th Sector.

To : Military and civilian personnel serving in the agencies of hamlets,
villages, and districts in the 25th Sector.

Subject: The Relationship with the Vietnamese cadre and combatants and the
security measures to be taken in protecting and checking them.

In compliance with the spirit of the Indochinese Summit Conference in Saigon and Phnom Penh, pertaining to mutual assistance in the struggle against the American imperialists and their lackeys, who are our common enemy; the mutual respect of sovereignty, territorial integrity, and nonaggression towards each other; and with the purpose of preserving the ((Red)) Khmer-Vietnamese soldiers' **solidarity** from becoming divided, the result of which will be beneficial for the American imperialists and their lackeys who are carrying out a plan to sow dissension and **distrust** between our soldiers and people as a means to facilitate their efforts to turn our countries into their **neocolony** and build the military bases they need for their war of aggression against the people of Indochina and Asia in general, the Front Committee of the 25th Sector prescribes the following:

1. Vietnamese cadre and soldiers operating in Khmer territory should respect the sovereignty, territorial integrity, habits, customs, and Buddhist rules of the Khmers, and should obey instructions of the Khmer security guards who, in return, should maintain the character of a guard of the host country, should observe discipline properly, and should be polite in words and manners in accordance with the revolutionary ethics of the Khmer Republic.
2. Only Comrade Huat Se is entitled to contact and issue travel passes to the Vietnamese cadre and soldiers operating in the 25th Sector.
3. When checking the travel **passes** of Vietnamese cadre and soldiers, the Khmer cadre, soldiers, guerrillas, and militiamen should display a spirit of internationalism, respect each other in the sense of equality, and forgive every small mistake and unkindness displayed by the travelers. Any Vietnamese cadre or soldier operating in the 25th Sector, who travels **without a pass**, is to be sent back to his parent units' installation according to the address recorded on his identification card. If the passless traveler is from outside the 25th Sector, however, he is to be kept for investigation. In this case, the **detainee** should be treated with politeness. Such bad manners as boasts, threats, or vengeance are to be avoided.

4. The detainee is to be evacuated to the Foreign Relations Committee of the 25th Sector as soon as possible. Any Khmer cadre or soldier who disobeys this guideline, and thus prejudices the friendship of the peoples of our two countries, will be responsible for the results of his action.

5. Cadre of sector and district agencies, soldiers, village guerrillas, and hamlet militiamen are to study and implement this circular successfully with best regards to discipline and organization.

From: Chairman of the 25th Sector

To: Cadre of sector and district agencies, soldiers, village guerrillas,
and hamlet militiamen.

Subject: Regulations on bivouacking and moving of VN Liberation Troops ((VC/NVA)).

In compliance with the spirit of the conference of the ((25th)) Sector Front Committee held between Comrades Chey (Committee member), Huat Se (Security Chief concurrently in charge of foreign relations), and Thanh Binh (member of the Liaison Committee of VN) on 11 Jan 72; in conformance with the spirit of the Indochinese Summit Conference relating to mutual assistance on the basis of equality, sovereignty, territorial integrity, non-aggression between each other, and nonintervention into each other's internal affairs; and for the common interest in the struggle against the American imperialists and their lackeys in Saigon and Phnom Penh who are our ((Red Khmer/VC/NVA)) common enemy, the Front Committee of the 25th Sector prescribes the following regulations:

1. The messing, billeting, and moving of cadre and soldiers of the Vietnamese ((VC)) Liberation ((Front)) are to be kept within the following limitations:

Agencies of An Giang Province ((VC Region 2)), such as 020, B415, HT110, and B125, are authorized to operate in Koh Thom and Leuk Dek Districts ((Kandal Province, Khmer Republic)).

Agencies Z15, Z30, A15, and 040 are authorized to operate in Sa-Ang and Kien Svay Districts ((Kandal Province, Khmer Republic)).

2. Command cadre of all agencies such as the Foreign Relation Committee; the Front Committee of An Giang Province; the Command Committees of Z15, Z30, 020 etc ... ((sic)) are authorized to travel freely in the 25th Sector in the performance of their missions.

3. The Vietnamese Liaison Committee is entitled to issue passes to the Vietnamese cadre and soldiers for travel in the areas surrounding their bivouacking sites in the 25th Sector. The pass is to be written on both sides, one side in Vietnamese and the other in Khmer, and signed by Comrade Thanh Binh.

4. Comrade Huat Se, of the ((Red Khmer)) Foreign Relation Committee, is entitled to issue travel passes to Vietnamese cadre and soldiers for travel within the 25th Sector only. A pass for travel to other sectors is to be issued by Comrade Sok Bout Chamreun, Chairman of the 25th Sector.

5. ((Red Khmer)) cadre of sector and district agencies, soldiers, village guerrillas, and hamlet militiamen in charge of checking the passes of the Vietnamese cadre and soldiers should display a spirit of internationalism, maintain the character of a guard of the host country, observe discipline and revolutionary ethics properly, show respect to each other on the basis of equality, and avoid displaying such mannerisms as boasts, threats, or vengeance that may be prejudicial to the solidarity between the people and troops of our two countries.

6. Cadre and soldiers are to study and observe this regulation properly.
